What is SITE?

Steroid Innovations and Treatment Education (SITE) is a continuing medical education (CME) program funded by a grant from Sirion Therapeutics. The program consists of a series of 20 live Webcasts hosted on www.SITECME.org.

What is the format of the live Webcasts?

Each Webcast is 1 hour and follows the format below:

30-minute pre-taped slide presentation

15-minute live case study presentation

10-minute polling questions

10-minute question and answer session

Participants are able to see and hear the host faculty via Webcast technology. **No phone dial-in is required.** Questions are submitted through the Webcast player. The questions will appear on the screen of the host faculty in real time and he will read them aloud if he wishes to address the question.

Can a participant submit a case?

Participants have the opportunity to submit a case study during registration that will be considered by the host faculty for presentation during the live case study presentation. Deadline for submission is 1 week prior to Webcast.

How do potential attendees participate?

- Call (888) 318-7292, Monday through Friday, 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM EST
- After hours, leave a message for a return call within 12 hours

Confirmation emails are sent upon registration with instructions on accessing the live event.

What are the technical requirements?

- Adobe Flash Player version 8 or higher
- Broadband Internet connection
- Soundcard and speakers or headphones

Included in the registration confirmation email is a simple computer compatibility test to ensure the best experience. Green check marks should be received at the end of this test. Should any issues occur, contact

How does an attendee access the live event?

Email and phone reminders will be sent the day prior to the event.

If previously registered:

- Access the link provided in the registration confirmation email
- Enter the email address to login OR
- On the "Events" page, click on "Join Webcast"

Please note: the Webcast is accessible up to half an hour before the live event.

If NOT previously registered:

- Register via the website: www.SITECME.org
- Call (888) 318-7292, Monday through Friday, 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM EST
- Follow the instructions as a registered attendee

Registration is required at least 10 minutes prior to the Webcast start time to obtain full CME.

How does a group participate in the event?

A single person from the group should register in advance then join the event 15 minutes in advance.

How many credits will attendees receive?

- MDs: 1 AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™. No more than 1 hour of credit can be issued to each participant
- COAs/COTs: 1 Category B JCAHPO credit for participation in 2 webcasts (one uveitis and one post-surgical). No more than 1 hour of credit will be issued
- COMTs: 1 Category B JCAHPO credit for one webcast. No more than 1 hour of credit will be issued
- ODs: COPE (Council on Optometric Practitioner Education) pending -Credit can be retroactively assigned to any of the Webcast events

How does a participant obtain CME credit?

- Complete event participation
- Post-test page will automatically appear
- Answer 10 multiple choice questions on content
- Answer evaluation questions (not required, but encouraged)
- Score 70% or higher (required to receive credit)
- Printable certificate will appear on screen
- PDF of certificate is also sent via email to user login email
- Medical Education Resources (MER) is the accrediting body and will update their database accordingly

Participants do not need to complete the post-test immediately after an event. They are able to login in up to 3 months after an event to take the post-test and obtain credit. Access to post-tests will appear at the bottom of the "Events" page immediately after the event has taken place.



How does a participant obtain credit if watching the Webcast as part of a group?

A participant can register to take the post-test up to 3 months after the live event takes place. If the participant has problems with this process, they should call the SITE help line.

Will the Webcasts be archived?

One event from each program, which will include approximately 3 of the best cases, will be available on the website March 1, 2009. Users will have the ability to watch the event and take the post-test at their own convenience.

What if an event is cancelled/rescheduled?

- Notification will be sent to all registrants via email and phone
- An alert will be added to the "Schedule of Events" on the www.CMESITE.org
